Deacon's Diary

In our gospel from Mark this week we hear Jesus correct the people of His day by quoting the words from the Prophet Isaiah: "This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines human precepts."

What He was saying was mostly directed to the Pharisees, but we know these words are also directed toward us almost twenty centuries later. At times, don't we come to Mass as a mere precept, (general rule) rather than coming to change our heart to make a difference in our world. Although skipping Mass without a serious reason is a "grave sin," coming to receive Jesus without a desire to be more like Him is an even greater sin; we miss the mark of greater potential.

We have many ways in our Catholic Faith to achieve our greater potential. We can get involved in the many ministries that our parishes have, that brings Christ to others. Our churches need help with lecturers, home-bound ministers, proclaiming the Word, extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist, Catechists, Mass servers, parish or finance council members.

Besides all those, one of the most rewarding ways I have found in service to others is being a member of the Knights of Columbus. Founded on the principles of charity, unity and fraternity, the Knights of Columbus was established in 1882 by Father Michael J. McGivney, assistant pastor of St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Conn., and a group of parishioners. Their intent? To bring financial aid and assistance to the sick, disabled and needy members and their families. Today, Father McGivney is being considered for sainthood.

Our United in Charity Appeal provides support to all of our initiatives and special projects - like the 3,000 prayer kits that were assembled during the 2022 Warriors to Lourdes trip and sent to Ukrainian soldiers. Gifts to the United in Charity allow the Knights to meet our most pressing needs

quickly. Your generous gift today will directly support displaced Ukrainian citizens both now and as they rebuild after the war. When disaster strikes, our volunteers are ready with supplies and aid in impacted communities around the world.

Over 1 million moms have seen their unborn children thanks to the Knights of Columbus Ultrasound Program. Since 2009, Knights of Columbus has funded more than 1,500 ultrasound machines through donations from councils and charitable donors. When families struggle to clothe their children with warm coats in the winter, Knights of Columbus councils help meet this basic need with Coats for Kids. Since 2014, Christians who have fled the religious persecution in the Middle East receive humanitarian and spiritual aid.

Why not let your faith become more than just a precept. I invite any members in our parishes to consider calling one of our parish offices to find out what ministries are in need of your help. I also ask you men to prayerfully consider seeking out a member of the Knights of Columbus or talk to me to get more information on how you can be a part of an organization based on the principals of charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism.
