Deacon's Perspective

Our readings this weekend, which happens to be the 2nd from the last Sunday in this Liturgical Year turn a little dark, or **scripturally speaking “Apocalyptic”**.

This simply points to a focus on end times. Perhaps we are in the end times or maybe not; only God the Father knows for sure. But what does mean for us, or rather how shall we consider these readings in the context of our times? Here are two

questions to consider: “Do we allow the negative elements of apocalyptic imagery to daunt and overwhelm us? Or, do we allow our hearts to be consoled by the image of the glorious Son of Man, coming on the clouds to gather his chosen and faithful ones from all over the earth? I prefer the latter. The “Light of our Faith” must prevail!

The Gospel for this Sunday comes from St Mark chapter 13:24-32, which is set very near to when Jesus enters Jerusalem and His Passion, or as we refer the **“Paschal Mystery”**. **Scriptural context I always think is important and especially today’s Gospel, and perhaps if all of us would read the bible we might get a better picture of what takes place with Jesus and His disciples. We would read from last Sunday after the “Poor Widow’s Contribution”, Jesus talking about the “Destruction of the Temple”, “the Signs of the End”, “the Coming Persecution”, and “The Great Tribulation”. And today’s Gospel speaks about the “The Coming of the Son of Man.**

“Hopelessness is useless because

God won’t abandon us”. “God wants us to use our gifts, in all aspects of our lives as a way to help fulfill God’s will. And what is God’s will for us; a question I’ve been asked often. It’s really quite simple! God’s will for all of us is to “be holy, because I am Holy” (1 Peter 1:16). Holiness, and abandonment to God’s Holy Will is crucial in today’s crazy and dark world.

I was reading a story about Helen Keller and this particular part spoke loudly to me, perhaps you as well.

Despite her deafness and blindness, she was always inspiring. She once wrote a magazine article entitled: **“Three Days to See.”** In that article she outlined what things she would like to see if she were granted just three days of sight. It was a powerful, thought- provoking article.

On the first day she said she wanted to see friends. Day two she would spend seeing nature. The third day she would spend in her home city of New York watching the busy city and the workday of the present.

She concluded it with these words: **“I who am blind can give one hint to those who see: Use your eyes as if tomorrow you were stricken blind.”**

It is little wonder then that one of the signs of the coming of the Jesus the Messiah was that the blind should receive their sight...

If YOU were not able to see like Helen Keller, and were granted three days of sight, what would YOU like to see on each of those three days?

“Be holy, because I Am Holy”, and tell God that ‘you want to be saints!



Christmas Cheer

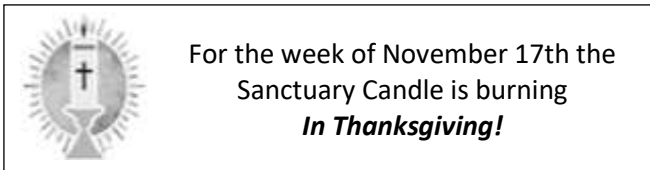

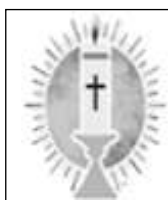
