

Deacon's Perspective by Deacon Dennis Bennin

This weekend begins the Fourth Week of Advent, which is a short week because of Christmas Day three days later. Our time of preparation is nearly over, and we begin our celebration for the Christ Child. In our Gospel we see Mary who was traveling to the hill country in haste to visit her cousin Elizabeth who is pregnant. I always marvel at Mary's visit and conversation with the Angel Gabriel in which she learned that she was highly favored by God; because Gabriel said "Hail favored one! The Lord is with you." Can you imagine what this encounter looked and felt like? It's hard to fully comprehend. I know we've heard this story many times, but it's so spell binding, in how a simple, young girl, probably 15 vears old was told she was going to bear the "Son of God" in her womb. Think about this!

On my desk is a reproduction of a print by Fra Angelico called 'The Annunciation', and this particular print has a unique aspect that has captivated my soul. In this painting we see the Angel Gabriel bowing in deep reverence to Mary (Our Blessed Mother)

who is seated on a bench. What I find so unique is what Fra Angelico included with this painting; he inserted the words between what Gabriel said to Mary (small letters), and Mary's response to Gabriel which is backwards and upside down. So in other words, Fra Angelico's interpretation of Mary saying "how can this be, since I have no relations with a man" has her completely flummoxed. Yet, she had the capacity to say, "May it be done to me, according to your word." The Church calls this in which Mary gave her response as her "Fiat"?

"Fiat" means "yes" in the context of the Catholic Faith, when referring to

the Virgin Mary's response to the Angel Gabriel where she says: "let it be done to me according to your word." "Fiat' is a Latin word meaning "let it be done." When I saw this picture the first time, I understood in a rudimentary way, on a human level, what Mary's yes or rather her "fiat' really meant. So when the Angel Gabriel and our Blessed Mother had their encounter which was an intense mystical experience, we hear from a 15-year girl say "May it be done to me according to your word." We know that the Holy Spirit 'Overshadowed' Mary, and that the Creator of all things visible and invisible, that which cannot be contained, is now incarnated and contained in Mary's womb.

Whenever there is an encounter with the God of the Universe, whether in the Eucharist, the Word, those who we

encounter each day, God is calling us, and sending us out on Mission, and He is waiting for our 'Fiat'. The question always comes down to saying 'Yes' or as Mary said; may it be done to me according to your word. Mary didn't just say 'Yes' because any yes, can easily become a 'No'. She submitted to the Will of God without hesitation, and then she

went to the hill country to visit her cousin Elizabeth who was also pregnant.

In the writings from Louisa Piccarreta Jesus said, "True seriousness is found in religion, and true religion consists in looking at one's neighbor in God, and at God in one's neighbor." (Book 4, November 1, 1902). I pray your Advent is leading you to a greater encounter with the Living God, and that you incarnate Jesus Christ in all that you do, and all that you say. And like Our Blessed Mother, be unafraid to look at your neighbor in God, and at God in your neighbor. I pray you have a Blessed and Holy Christmas Season!

Joy to the World, The Lord Has Come!

May the blessings, the joy and the amazement of the Incarnation – God coming to earth! – be with you and your loved ones during this Christmas season and throughout the coming year! Let us raise the roof with praise! Glory to God in the highest!!
