

When I was a young child, I would often list the Ten Commandments from easiest to hardest to follow: the most difficult commandment often changing, depending on the week. Sometimes, it was taking the It is because Divine Savior and other Catholic Lord's name in vain. Another week, after spying a fellow student's new Trapper Keeper, it was coveting a neighbor's possessions. One commandment that usually ended up near the bottom of the list was the first one: "I, the Lord, am your God. You shall not have any other gods besides me." I wasn't planning on praying to any golden calves, so I felt there was no need to focus on that one. However, this was a very child-like mindset to the commandment. It wasn't until I grew older and gained a deeper understanding of God's Word, that I acquired a more mature understanding of what God meant and how difficult this commandment can be.

In his letter to the Colossians, St. Paul identifies more abstract ideas of idolatry: passion, fame, and wealth. These can be very alluring ideas in our world today, which can cause us to stumble and lose focus. St. Paul asks us to instead "clothe ourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience." He calls us to "let the peace of Christ rule in our hearts," reminding us that, as followers of Christ, He must remain at the core of all that we do. That truly strikes at the heart of what the first commandment is about: placing Christ at the center.

As we reflect on this, I would like to

bridge this idea to Catholic education. As an educator and principal of a Catholic School, I am often asked about why I chose to be a part of Catholic education. Schools don't simply teach students facts and figures but strive to form the whole person, integrating faith with learning. It encourages us to see the world through the lens of Christ's love and teachings, empowering us to live with compassion, humility, and service. In a Catholic school, Christ is not separated from subjects like math or history; He is the foundation of all knowledge, inspiring both academic excellence and moral integrity.

In every classroom, every lesson, and every interaction, the goal is to keep Christ at the center—so that we may grow in wisdom and in virtue. This is why Catholic education is not just about academic success, but about helping students become the people God calls them to be, living lives that reflect the peace and love of Christ. And when these students graduate from that education, they have that Christ-centered mindset to combat the competing interests of greed, passion, and notoriety as they traverse through the world beyond the classroom.

As Catholic Schools Week is set to begin on January 26th, let us ask the Lord for the grace to live out our faith with integrity, always remembering to keep Him at the center of all that we do, especially in our learning and growth.




