Deacon's Perspective

This 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time presents us with very interesting and striking readings, especially from the Epistle from the Letter from James. We hear James tell us in 3:16 the following:

“Where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there is disorder and every foul practice”.

You might be wondering why James would write this, and why is he warning his listeners about this? The bible is one of the best way to answer this question. So when I go to my bible, there is usually a brief heading of a word or two describing the subsequent verses. This is purposeful and helpful to gain an insight for the reader, and in this case the heading preceding Chapter 3 says: **“Power of the Tongue”**. As I read this I wondered where James was going with this, so I read further, and he indicated in 3:9 the following: **“With it (tongue) we bless the Lord and Father, and with it (tongue) we curse human beings who are made in the image and likeness of God.”** This I think is a clear, so I guess it would be good for us to be mindful of the Power of our Tongue.

I bring this up because if we pay close attention to the Opening Prayer (Collect), you will hear the priest (Fr Amadi) say the following:

“O God, who founded all the commands of your sacred Law upon love of you and of our neighbor, grant that, by keeping your precepts, we may merit to attain eternal life.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.” Amen.

This is a beautiful prayer, and sets the tone for not only this Mass but really each Mass we participate in. We are a pilgrim people on our way to eternity with God, and James is pointing out to us what can be a hindrance or impediment in our journey. I.e., **“Jealousy and selfish ambition”**.

How often do we think about our going to Heaven? Do we give it any thought, or is that something we put off, and or delay in thinking about? This is for some an uncomfortable or frightening prospect. But eternity is forever, and God wants all of children Home with Him.

I know many people who have delayed or refused to think about this subject, and **that’s okay and of course their decision**. But for how long?

The prayers for this particular Mass are filled with much for us to ponder, for **example the “Prayer Over The Offerings”**. Here is another prayer that can escape some of us when the priest prays over **the ‘bread and wine’ at the Altar**. Please pay close attention to this one!

“Receive with favor, O Lord, we pray, the offering of your people, that what they profess with devotion and faith may be theirs through these heavenly mysteries. Through Christ our Lord.” Amen.

My hope and prayer for all of us, is that we realize that each of us are made in the image and likeness of God, and that we should treat each other with dignity and respect. That old saying might be **good to remember: “WWJD” or “Walk With Jesus Daily”**

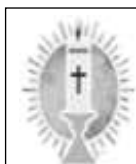
